Priorities

The current SNT priorities were set at a meeting held at Elmswell Police Office on Thursday 8th January 2015. They are presently;

- 1) Deal with and prevent Burglary other building offences
- 2) Deal with and prevent heating oil theft offences

As a result we will be looking to offer crime prevention advice where appropriate. We will also be giving out crime prevention equipment such as property marking pens where necessary or requested. We will be targeting patrols in areas identified and affected by such offences.
