<u>General</u>

As of 1 March there are 3 highways issues logged on the Suffolk Highways website (discounting duplicates); vis.

- 1. Blocked drain(s) at jcn of Chapel Lane and Gedding Road. Suffolk CC Highways are not taking action but have added it to their routine inspection programme.
- 2. Flooding at Park Road, between Whitefield House and Stone Cottage. I have a meeting arranged for 8:30am with Matthew Fox, Suffolk CC Highways Engineer to inspect the problem.
- 3. Flooding on highway near Church Cottage, The Street. This issue has been logged by a resident, and a resident (possibly the same person) has separately emailed me requesting some resolution to a long standing problem. This overrun of flood water onto the highway is coincidentally where a road traffic accident took place on 29th Feb.
