Welcome to Drinkstone

We know there is a lot to do when you settle into a new place without worrying about where your nearest shop/vet/ petrol station is, or which bin is collected on which day. With this in mind, we thought it would be useful to gather together as much local information as possible for all newcomers to this lovely village.

We hope you will find it useful. Neighbours are often the first point of contact in a community, but please feel free to contact the Parish Councillors or the Churchwardens for any information and help that you may need.

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About Drinkstone

Drinkstone is unusual in that it has no village centre. It is widespread geographically in three clusters, Drinkstone (Church end), Drinkstone Park and Drinkstone Green to the south. We have two telephone exchange codes (01359 & 01449), Drinkstone Green end comes under the Stowmarket exchange, while the rest of the village comes under Pakenham.

The resources seem modest – about 650 people, a Playing Field (known locally as the 'Cricket'), two allotment sites, two Windmills, a 14th century Church and a Village Hall, opened in 2013. But there is much going on beneath the surface. A considerable number of clubs, sports, activities and social events take place in the village.

Drinkstone is a quiet, unspoilt village, surrounded by beautiful countryside. It is classified as a 'Hamlet' in the Mid Suffolk Local Plan which means that development will only be permitted within the settlement boundary and subject to strict criteria. We have few facilities—yet nowhere is far away. Day to day shopping needs, plus a Health Centre and Pharmacy can be found in Woolpit—only two miles away. Just about everything else can be found in Bury St Edmunds (7 miles) or Stowmarket (5 miles).

Drinkstone has an extensive footpath network. A map showing all the paths can be found on the *Useful links and information* section of the Village Website; see page 4 for website address.

Parish Council

The current council was elected in May 2023 in an uncontested election. A list of the current councillors with contact details can be found on the PC website <https://www.drinkstoneparishcouncil.gov.uk/>

Council meetings are open to all parishioners and members of the public. Meetings are held in the Village Hall 8 times during the year, generally on Mondays at 8 pm. The schedule of meetings can be found on the Parish Council website together with past minutes and many other documents. The agenda for each meeting is issued by the Parish Clerk in advance via the Drinkstone Information service.

The council is currently directly responsible for providing and managing the allotments, maintaining the playing field and the play equipment, providing waste bins, seats and maintaining the village sign. Local services

Bin collection from 1st June 2026– refuse (black) , recycling (black bins with blue lids) paper and card (black bins with green lids) and waste are collected on a three-week cycle. There is also a weekly food waste collection in a smaller grey bin. Put your bin out the night before. Garden waste (brown bins are collected on a two-week cycle. . Full details, including information on how to order a brown bin, are available on the Mid Suffolk District Council website

To London via Ipswich & Colchester. Frequent trains from Stowmarket to London Liverpool Street – journey time approximately 1 hr 20 minutes

To Norwich. Approximately hourly from Stowmarket – journey time approximately 30 minutes

To Cambridge. Ipswich to Cambridge service, approximately hourly stops at Stowmarket, Elmswell, Thurston and Bury St Edmunds – journey time from Thurston approximately 50 minutes.
