Good afternoon Michael,

Thank you for your email.

The issue stems from the occupier/applicants belief that the settlement boundary is as shown on the attached as 'new line of settlement boundary'. However the settlement boundary is as established through the adopted (May 2021) Drinkstone Neighbourhood Plan, which is as shown in the below image. This is taken from our interactive mapping service - Cadcorp SIS WebMap 9.



It is my understanding that the only boundary correction that was made through the Neighbourhood Plan examination (early 2020) relates to a site adjacent to Greyfriars, Rattlesden Road [see page 26 in the exam report, and page 4 of the examination correspondence document].

The only way to amend the boundary is either through the Parish Council reviewing their Neighbourhood Plan or, through the District Council Local Plan when the boundaries are reviewed.

I hope this is of assistance.


